

Project overview

Jerrabomberra High School opens Day 1 Term 1 2023 in purpose built temporary facilities located at Jerrabomberra Public School. The temporary site will have 22 buildings for students in Years 7 and 8.

Active ways to get to school



Walking is an active and healthy way to get to school

- There is a Children's Crossing on Firethorn Place which operates before and after school hours. When in use, red flags displaying the words Children Crossing will be used.
- Always use crossing facilities such as pedestrian crossings, traffic lights or a school crossing:
 Stop Look Listen and Think.
- Share the footpath and walk on the left.
- Look out for cars entering or leaving driveways.



Ride your bike

- Always wear a correctly fitted helmet.
- Ride to the left on footpaths.
- Take extra care near busy roads such as Jerrabomberra Parkway.
- Watch out for cars entering or leaving driveways.
- Give 1 metre space when riding past other people.







Ride your scooter

- Always wear a correctly fitted helmet.
- Wear a bright-coloured bag, clothing or reflectors such as a vest to be highly visible.
- Give pedestrians right of way on footpaths.
- Check your wheels, handlebars, brakes and frame are in good condition before riding.




Buses

There are two public buses that stop on Coachwood Avenue:

- bus route 835 Queanbeyan Interchange to Jerrabomberra via Letchworth
- bus route 836 Queanbeyan Interchange to Jerrabomberra via Jerrabomberra North Tce
- more information on timetables is available on the Transport NSW Trip Planner website: transportnsw.info/routes/bus.

Students in Year 7 to Year 12 can get a school travel pass from Transport for NSW if:

- the straight line distance from the student's home address to school is more than 2km, or
- the walking distance from home to school is 2.9km or further.

Kiss and drop expectations

- The Coachwood Avenue, Firethorn Place and Bayside Court Kiss and Drop zones allows a maximum 2 minutes of stopping time.
- To ease congestion the Coachwood Avenue Kiss and Drop is only available for high school parents and carers after
 3:20 pm in the afternoons.
- Make sure children use the Safety Door (rear footpath side) when getting in and out of a car.
- Drivers are to stay within 3 metres of their parked car.
- When the Kiss and Drop is full and you cannot enter, safely drive around the block to keep the traffic flowing.

Car parking and road safety


- The cul-de-sac at the end of Coachwood Avenue is now No Stopping.
- There is now 15 minute accessible parking on Coachwood Avenue.
- Park safely and turn legally, even if it means walking further to the school entrance.
- Give way to people walking or cycling particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always look around carefully, check mirrors and blind spots for children and other cars before:
 - opening your door
 - slowly reversing
 - pulling out from the side of the road or a parking area.

Benefits of not using a car to travel to and from school

Did you know children who live within 2 kilometres of school are often driven to school? That means many NSW children could be missing out on the physical, social and mental benefits of active travel-walking, riding or using public transport. Additionally, even active travel part way for one day per week can make a difference to our local traffic congestion. We can help bring these positive changes to Jerrabomberra by choosing active ways to get to school.

Safe travel

Parents and carers are responsible for their child's safety on the way to and from school. Parents and carers can reinforce what their children learn at school by planning and using safe school travel routes, model safe considerate behaviour and always follow road rules. Remember — road safety is everyone's responsibility.



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
